Violence Against Women

Reports show that many young women are sexually exploited in the Japanese entertainment industry. The investigation conducted by Human Rights Now revealed that there have been a number of cases in which young women, after being recruited as a “model” or “idol star” and signing contracts with agents, are forced into having sex in front of the camera. Acts of resistance by the women are met with threats of exorbitant amounts of penalty fees, exposure to families and schools, and coercion into performing sex without consent to be displayed as pornographic videos on the internet. This event will highlight the situation in Japan with an interview video of survivors and an investigative report. Introducing experiences from European countries, speakers will propose comprehensive, victim-centered strategies to combat this problem. A Q&A session will follow.
