1 Business results

In 2021, we continued to investigate and advocate for the human rights situations in the Asian region, including in Burma (Myanmar), Thailand, Cambodia, and China (human rights activists, violations of freedom of expression, business and human rights, and women and children's human rights), and we provided support for the restoration of democratic politics after the military coup in Myanmar. Due to the coronavirus pandemic, it will not be easy to provide local educational support, but we are making preparations.

We continued our advocacy at the United Nations General Assembly and Security Council in New York and the United Nations Human Rights Council in Geneva, and we continued to engage in global campaigns on issues such as women's rights, conflict, weapons and human rights, and the ICC.

In Japan, we collaborated with other organizations and lobbied the Ministry of Justice's Criminal Law Review Committee and Legislative Review Council to revise the criminal law in line with the actual situation of victims. In addition, with an eye on lowering the age of majority, we continued our advocacy efforts to resolve the issue of people being forced to appear in pornographic videos. In addition, we conducted follow-up on fact-finding on human rights issues related to China's Hong Kong and Uyghur regions and the military coup in Myanmar, and for business and human rights, we engaged with companies by industry and encouraged ESG investment. In addition, we worked on domestic human rights issues such as freedom of speech and expression and the rights of foreigners, and we continued to provide legal consultation to areas affected by the Great East Japan Earthquake.

Inter- national support project	Kluman Rights Violations Fact Investigation and Publication Project> We have continued to conduct fact—finding, collect information and publish reports on the human rights situation in Asian regions such as Myanmar, Cambodia, Thailand, China, and Hong Kong, where human rights situations are a concern, and to make recommendations to government agencies, the United Nations, etc. We also conducted lobbying activities, etc. With regard to China, where the human rights situation has worsened in recent years, we submitted a report to the United Nations regarding the crackdown on democracy movements in Hong Kong, we started weekly meetings and carried out a film event on large—scale attacks on the Uyghur people and we held an online event about human rights violations. 	In addition, in response to the military coup in Myanmar in February 2021, we released a statement together with other organizations condemning serious human rights violations against peaceful civilians and calling for the restoration of democratic rule. Together with Myanmar organizations living in Japan, we submitted an open letter of inquiry to the government and held a meeting based on the responses last year on continuing human rights violations against civil society being committed, and the group submitted a statement criticizing the					
	oppression of opposition parties and civil society. We also continued local information gathering, networking, and research related to business and human rights.					
Inter- national support project	In order to revise the criminal law in line with the actual situation of victims, we monitored the activities of the Ministry of Justice's "Criminal Law Review Committee on Sexual Crimes" and "Legislative Council" and conducted advocacy activities. In cooperation with other organizations, we sent requests and proposals to the government and political parties, and also strengthened activities to deepen the media's understanding and interest in criminal law reform through press lectures and press conferences. In addition, online events with timely themes such as digital sexual violence and sexual consent were also successfully held. In addition, we conducted a number of lobbying activities, including official meetings, in order to request legislation to address the issue of forcing people to appear in pornographic videos, which was a concern due to the lowering of the age of majority in April 2022. 	government to track and disclose their							
	suppliers, and to improve domestic laws,							
	and we held a press conference.							
	Regarding the Y Complex development in

	issued to investors and Japanese							
	companies stating that the development							
	may violate US sanctions. As for							
	awareness-raising activities, we have held							
	regular webinars and for the first time, we							
	have held a one-month intensive course							
	series called "Business and Human Rights
